ABOUT THE COURSE

Orthodoxtic appliances are the devices which transmit fortes to individual teeth or maxillofactal shaletal units to bring the changes within the bone with or without tooth movement which will help to achieve the treatment goals of functional efficiency, structural balance and esthetic harmony.

Orthodoutic appliances are divided into three main groups:

- A) Ramovahlo appliance
- B) Removable-Fined applicance
- C) Fined applicace

Removable Orthodoutic appliances hold a unique place in the orthodoutiet's armamentarium. The use of removable appliances still varies between clinicisms, but it is possible to achieve adequate coclusal improvement when suitable cases are chosm. Simple upping movements and few malocolusions will full into this category.
